



Acacia melanoxylon

Blackwood

Height:	5m - 30m
Width:	4m - 15m
Habit:	Fast-growing upright tree with a dense rounded crown.
Foliage:	Dull green phyllodes (leaves), variable in size to 15cm x 1-3cm.
Flowers:	Cream balls flowering from July to October.
Requirements:	Adaptable, but prefers deep moist soils and good drainage. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A long-lived tree providing good screening and shade. In cultivation, most Blackwoods will only grow up to 20m. Tolerates dryness once established. Tends to sucker if roots are damaged.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.

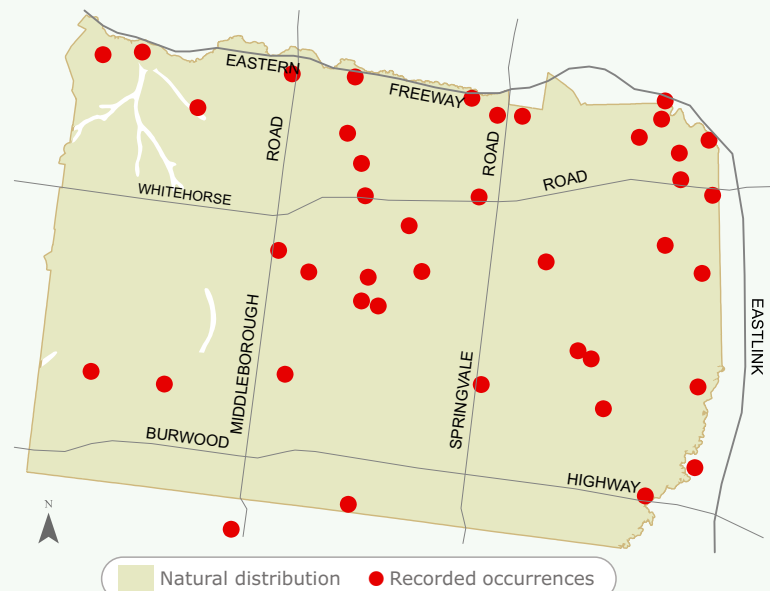
