



Acacia myrtifolia

Myrtle Wattle

Height:	1m - 3m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Fast-growing rounded or erect shrub.
Foliage:	Broad phyllodes (leaves) to 6cm long, often with yellow margins. New growth is bronze.
Flowers:	Profuse cream to yellow balls flowering from July to October.
Requirements:	Adaptable, most soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An ornamental shrub with reddish stems that is adaptable to most conditions. Suited as a low screen. A heavy prune can be beneficial.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

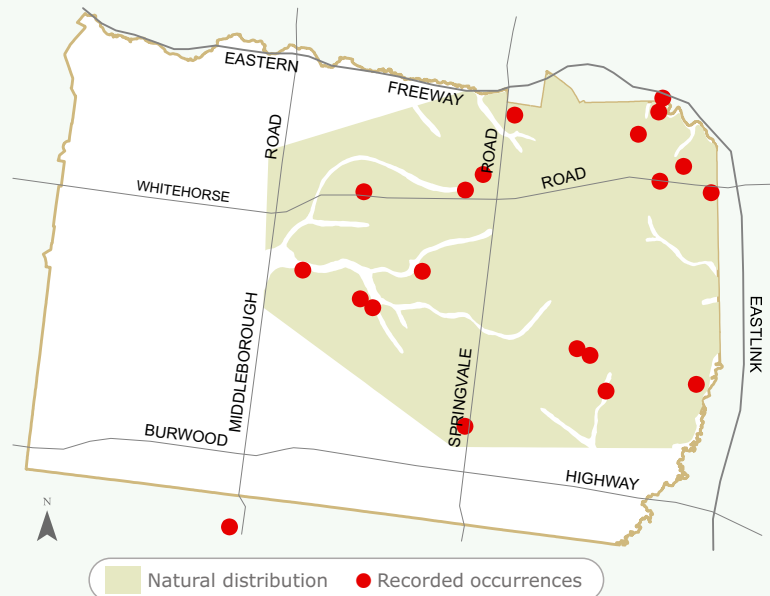
