



Acacia paradoxa

Hedge Wattle, Kangaroo Thorn

Height:	2m - 4m
Width:	2m - 5m
Habit:	Fast-growing dense and spreading shrub covered with thorns.
Foliage:	Dark green oblong to narrow phyllodes (leaves) with wavy edges, to 3cm long.
Flowers:	Abundant large golden yellow balls flowering from August to November.
Requirements:	Adaptable to any site. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A very ornamental wattle suited as a hedge or screen. The thorny habit provides ideal refuge for birds. It may be established below existing trees. Hardy, drought tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

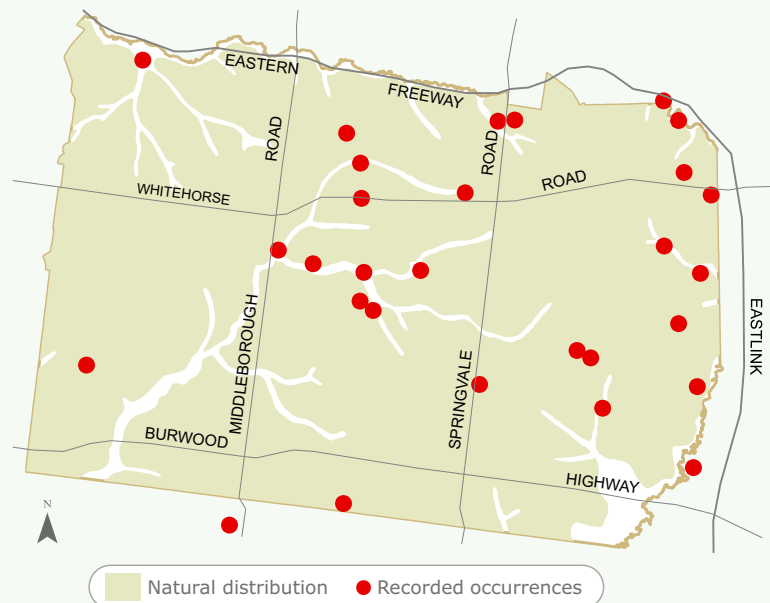
