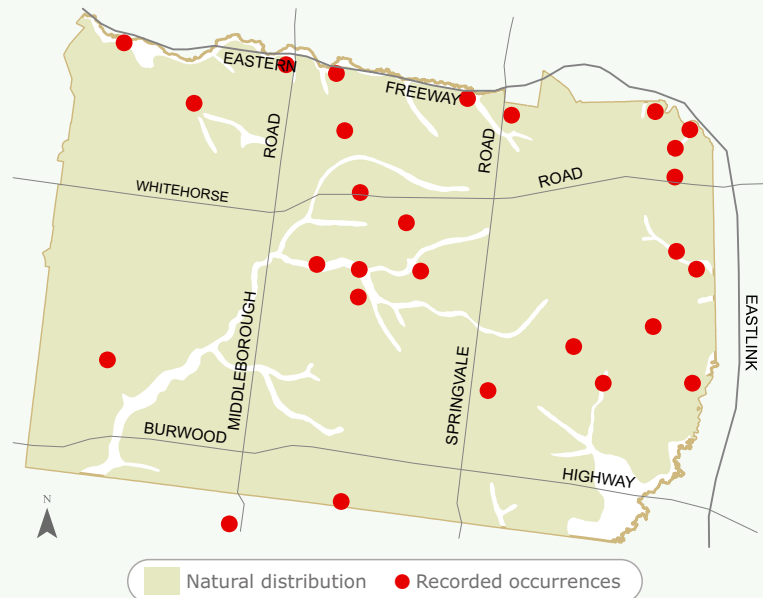
## Chocolate Lily

| <b>Height:</b>                 | 20cm - 80cm   |
| <b>Width:</b>                  | 20cm - 80cm   |
| <b>Habit:</b>                  | Tufted dwarf perennial herb.  |
| <b>Foliage:</b>                | Grass-like flat and narrow leaves that grow up to 40cm long and 1-10mm wide.  |
| <b>Flowers:</b>                | Violet flowers, rarely white, on branched erect stems that stand high above the foliage. Flowers are chocolate-caramel scented, from September to December. |
| <b>Requirements:</b>           | Well drained soils, adaptable to surroundings. Full or partial sun.   |
| <b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b> | An attractive plant used to add some interest to natural bushland areas. Plants die down to rootstock during summer. May be grown beneath trees.            |

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
