



# *Austrodanthonia fulva*

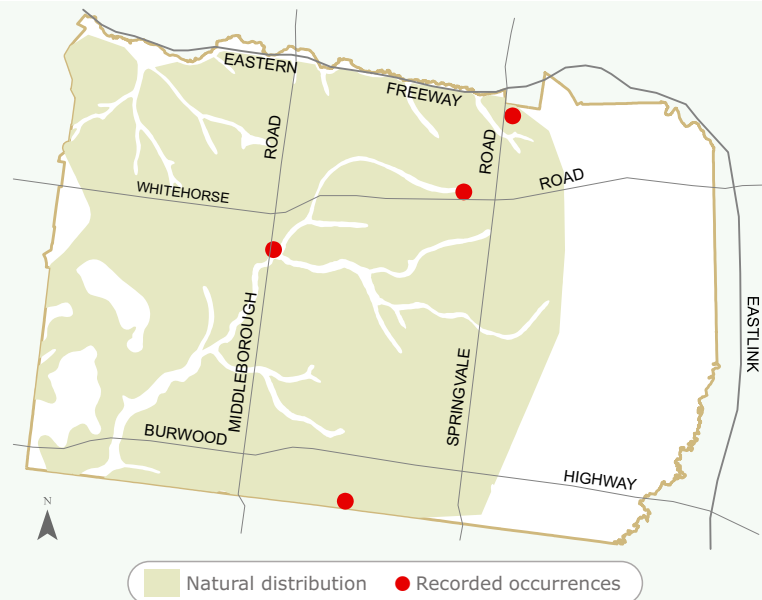
## Copper-awned Wallaby Grass

<b>Height:</b>	40cm, stems up to 1m
<b>Width:</b>	40cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Densely erect perennial grass.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Flat or channelled leaf to 30cm x 3mm.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Narrow green flowerheads, sometimes with purple edging, 6-12cm long, mostly from November to March.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Clay to light sandy loams, though prefers non sandy soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	Useful for planting under trees or to mix with other grasses. May be used to form a mat to prevent soil erosion.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
