

Austrodanthonia fulva Copper-awned Wallaby Grass

Height:	40cm, stems up to 1m
Width:	40cm
Habit:	Densely erect perennial grass.
Foliage:	Flat or channelled leaf to 30cm x 3mm.
Flowers:	Narrow green flowerheads, sometimes with purple edging, 6-12cm long, mostly from November to March.
Requirements:	Clay to light sandy loams, though prefers non sandy soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful for planting under trees or to mix with other grasses. May be used to form a mat to prevent soil erosion.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.




