

Austrodanthonia geniculata Kneed Wallaby Grass

Height:	15cm, stems to 30cm high
Width:	20cm
Habit:	Small tufted perennial grass with slender stems often bent near the base.
Foliage:	Fine bladed leaves that grow to 15cm long x 1mm with inrolled margins.
Flowers:	Compact purple grass-like flowerheads 1-5cm long in October to December and March. Mature flowerheads have a fluffy appearance.
Requirements:	Adaptable and tolerant to a variety of soils. Prefers a moist, slightly shaded position. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Ideal for mass planting. May be useful as a lawn grass.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
