

Austrodanthonia racemosa Clustered Wallaby Grass

Height:	20cm, stems to 60cm high
Width:	15cm
Habit:	Variable perennial grass from slender to densely tufting.
Foliage:	Fine and narrow light green leaves to 15cm long, flat to strongly inrolled.
Flowers:	Pale green flowerheads. Flowers most of the year, peaking in summer.
Requirements:	Dry to moist well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful as a native lawn, responds well to mowing.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.


