



# *Austrodanthonia setacea*

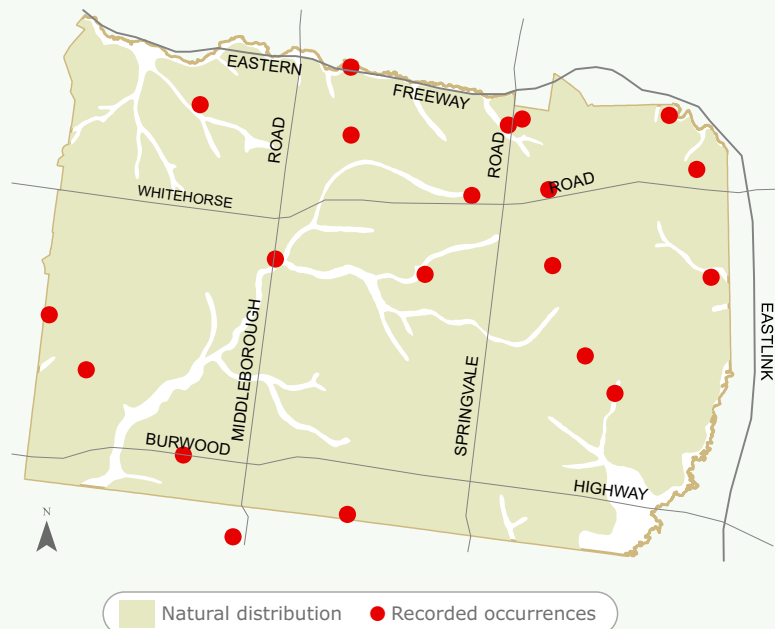
## Small-flowered Wallaby Grass, Bristly Wallaby Grass

<b>Height:</b>	30cm, stems to 60cm high
<b>Width:</b>	40cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Erect and slender densely tufting perennial grass.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Fine green leaves, inrolled to 20cm long x 1mm wide.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Pale green to purple flowerheads, from October to January.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable, ranging from sandy to heavy soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	Useful for planting under trees or to mix with other grasses.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
