

Billardiera scandens Common Apple-Berry


Height:	Twining shrub - climber
Width:	Twining shrub - climber
Habit:	A slender sprawling groundcover or soft climber with reddish wiry stems to 3m long.
Foliage:	Dark green leaves to 5cm long. New growth is soft, light green and hairy.
Flowers:	Greenish-yellow pendulous bell-shaped flowers to 2cm long throughout the year, with the main flowering period from June to January. A green oblong berry 2cm long x 1cm wide forms in summer, turning yellow when ripe.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, adaptable to most soils and aspects. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A light climber that is non-evasive makes this plant an attractive addition to any garden. It is suited as a ground trawling plant or climber over other plants and may be established beneath existing trees. Bird attracting.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
