



# *Bulbine bulbosa*

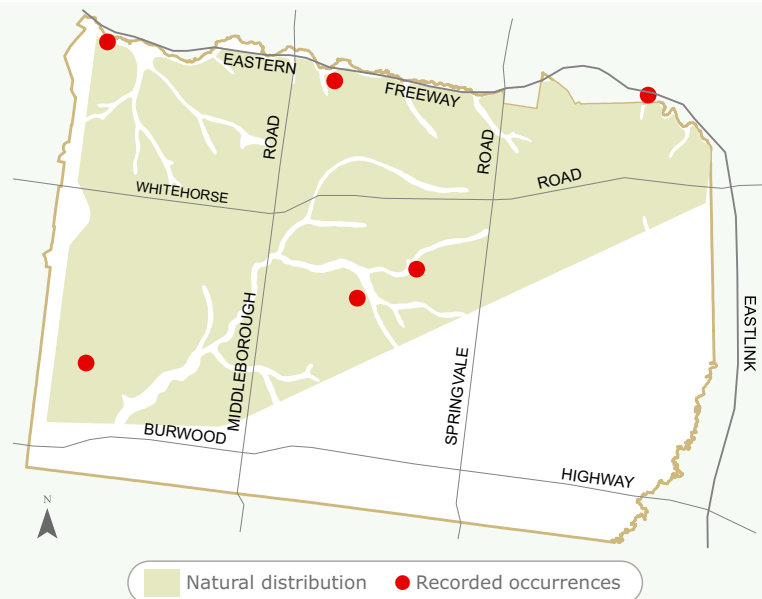
## Bulbine Lily

<b>Height:</b>	20cm - 60cm
<b>Width:</b>	30cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Densely tufted perennial herb.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Succulent rush-like green to green-grey erect leaves 40cm long, hollow and channelled along their length.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Star-like yellow fragrant flowers to 2cm wide on leafless erect stems to 60cm high. Flowers from September to January and sporadically throughout the year.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Moist, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An attractive plant, useful for planting in drifts, among rocks or cottage gardens. Plants die down to tuberous rootstock in dry weather but may produce new leaves and flower throughout the year.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
