



Caesia calliantha

Blue Grass Lily

Height:	10cm - 50cm
Width:	10cm - 50cm
Habit:	Tufted perennial herb with thick fibrous, tuberous rootstock.
Foliage:	Soft, flat and narrow grass-like leaves to 30cm x 15mm wide. Leaves die off annually after flowering.
Flowers:	Clusters of star-like lilac to blue flowers along erect stems to 50cm high. Flowers from September to February.
Requirements:	Prefers moist soils which dry out in Summer. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful rockery or cottage garden plant, which may grow larger and flower longer if summer moisture is available. Best when planted in drifts or in groups. Dies down to the dormant tuberous rootstock in summer.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

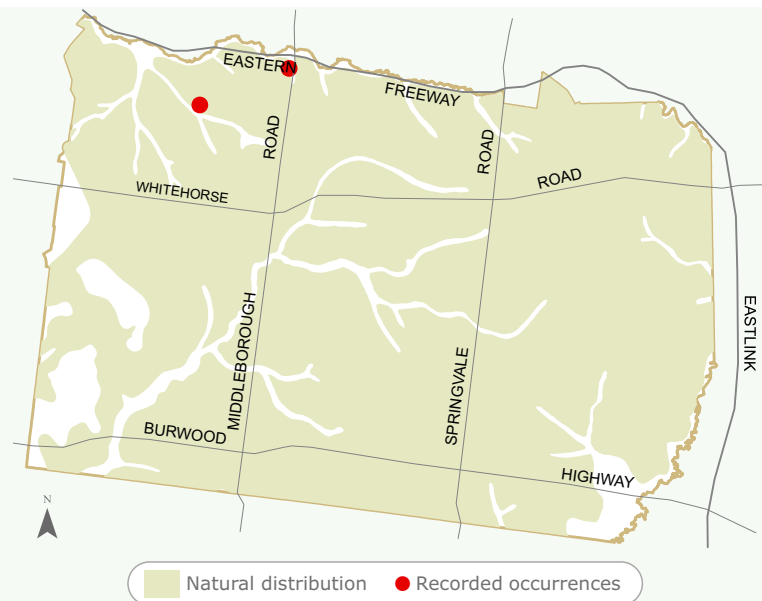
