



Clematis aristata

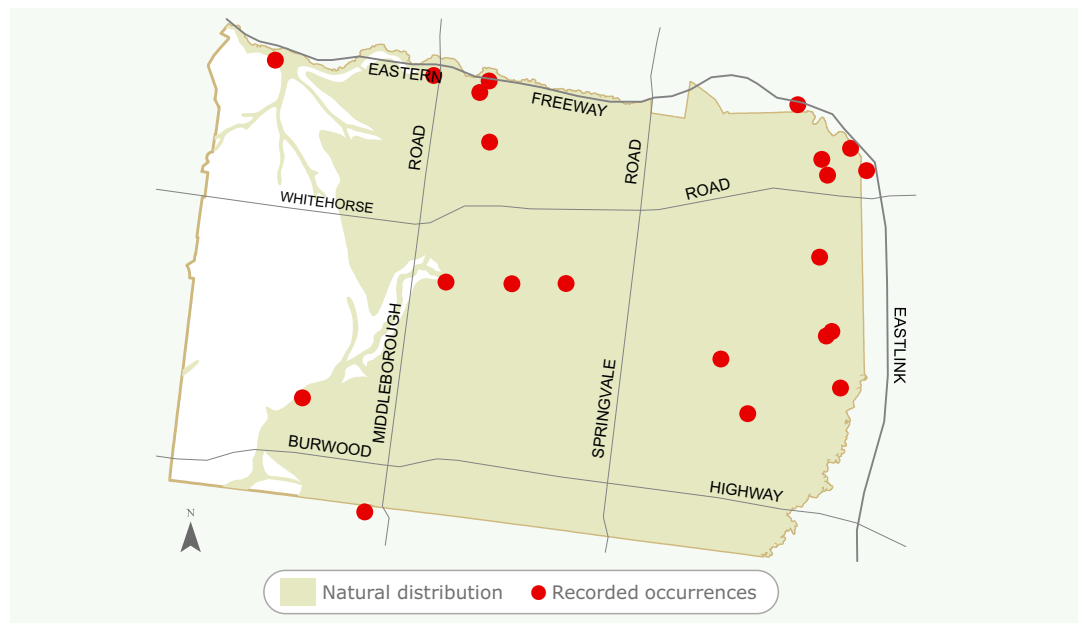
Austral Clematis, Goat's or Old Man's Beard

Height:	Climber
Width:	Climber
Habit:	Vigorous woody climber, suckering to form new plants.
Foliage:	Shiny green leaves, serrated edges, egg-shaped, up to 8cm long. Adult leaves are divided into 3 leaflets. Young leaves have silvery top markings, purple colour at base.
Flowers:	Masses of creamy white starry flowers 6cm wide. Flowers from August to March. Attractive feathery seed heads on female plants.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	May be easily trained to cover artificial supports such as fence or trellis. May be grown beneath trees. Benefits from pruning to make way for new growth.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
