



# *Clematis microphylla*

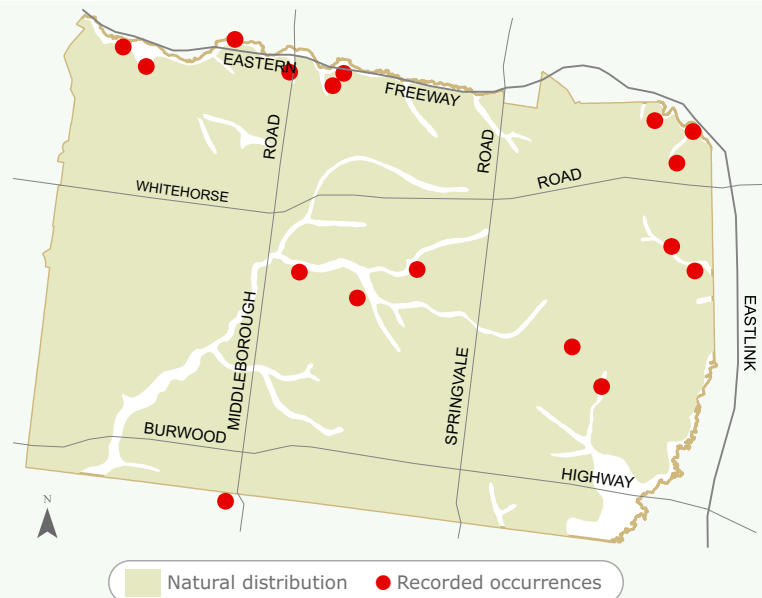
## Small-leafed Clematis

<b>Height:</b>	Climber
<b>Width:</b>	Climber
<b>Habit:</b>	Medium sized climber.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Dull light-green oblong leaves to 3cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Masses of cream starry flowers from July to November. Female plants develop clusters of feathery seed heads after flowering.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	A twining creeper useful as a screening plant or for covering fences. A moderately vigorous climber, it will smother small plants in a garden bed.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
