



Coprosma quadrifida


Prickly Currant Bush

Height:	2m - 4m
Width:	1m - 1.5m
Habit:	A prickly open upright dense shrub, ends of branches often spiny.
Foliage:	Small dull green oblong leaves to a slender tip 15mm long.
Flowers:	Inconspicuous single light greenish flowers at the end of short branches followed by a small round shiny orange-red fruit. Flowering from January to March.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, prefers moist sites. Shade or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A hardy plant, great for damp shady sites. Attractive to birds.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
