



Craspedia glauca syn. *variabilis*

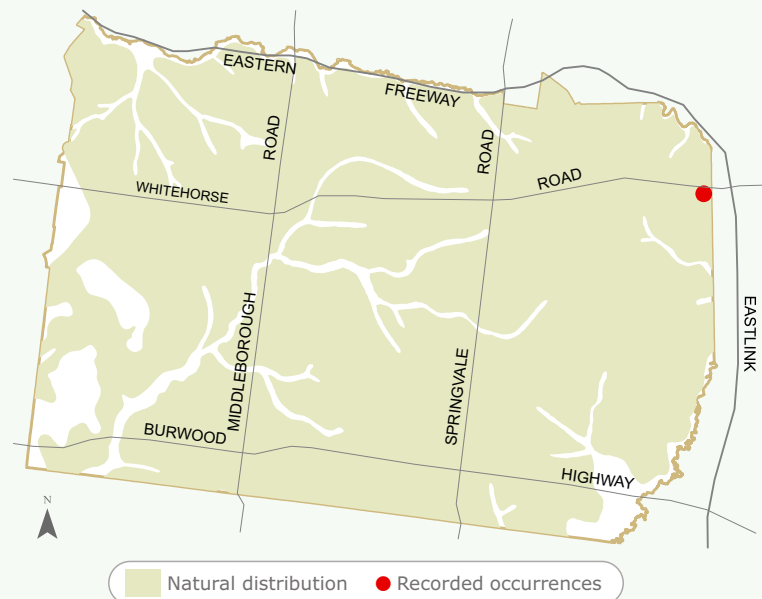
Common Billy Buttons

Height:	30cm, stems to 50cm
Width:	0.5m - 1m
Habit:	Erect tufted perennial herb.
Foliage:	Broad pale to olive green hairy leaves to 20cm long.
Flowers:	Yellow globular flowerheads to 2cm, on long singular erect stems from 15-50cm high. Flowers from September to November.
Requirements:	Moist to wet soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Spectacular in flower, effective in mass plantings. Suited to containers, rockeries and cottage gardens. Flowers are long lasting and can be used in fresh or dried flower arrangements. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

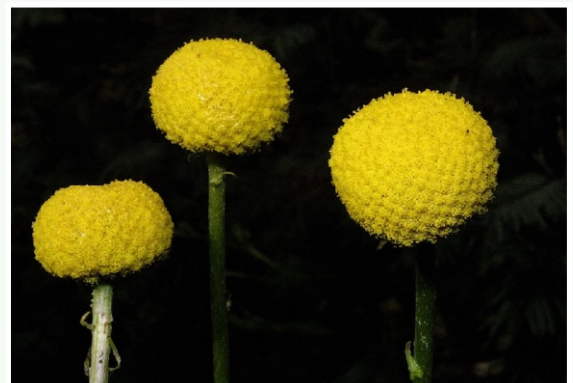
