



Crassula helmsii

Swamp Stonecrop

Height:	10cm - 30cm
Width:	Spreading
Habit:	Fast growing aquatic or creeping perennial herb.
Foliage:	Pairs of succulent green or reddish oblong narrow leaves to 15mm long.
Flowers:	Tiny white, tinged with red, four-petalled flowers, open on long erect stalks. Flowers from November to April.
Requirements:	Aquatic or bog conditions, adaptable to high salt levels. Full sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Branched stems creep or float and form dense mats. May be grown in ponds and dams, along water edges or in wet soils as a bog plant. May become invasive in ideal conditions. An excellent aquarium plant and a great weed suppressant. Tolerates temporary or prolonged flooding.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

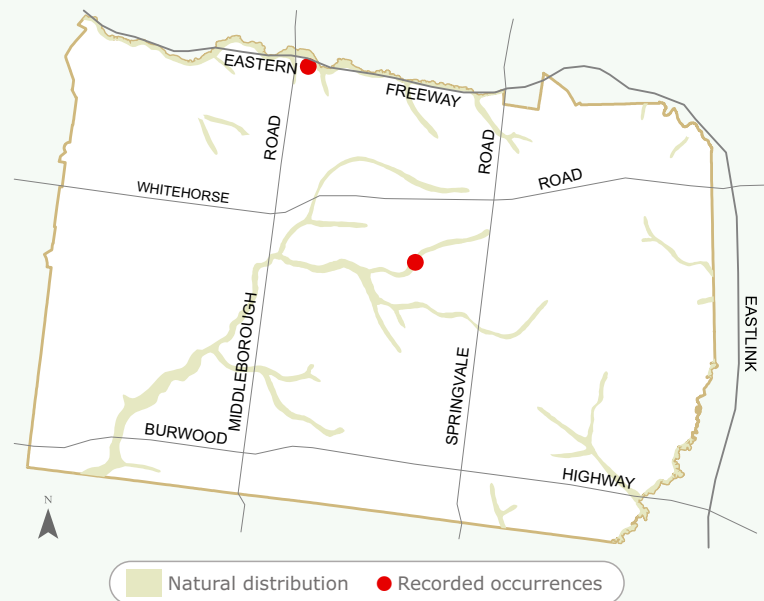
