



Dianella longifolia

Pale Flax Lily

Height:	30cm - 80cm, stems to 1m
Width:	50cm
Habit:	Upright tufted perennial herb with short thick underground stems and tuberous roots.
Foliage:	Soft bright green strap-like leaves to 80cm x 12mm wide.
Flowers:	Pale blue star-shaped flowers with yellow centres on erect stems to 1m high. Flowers open in the afternoon, from August to January, followed by eye-catching dark blue or purple berries.
Requirements:	Moist, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Attractive clumping plant, useful as an accent plant, in rockeries or cottage gardens. Hardy, good for growing under trees.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

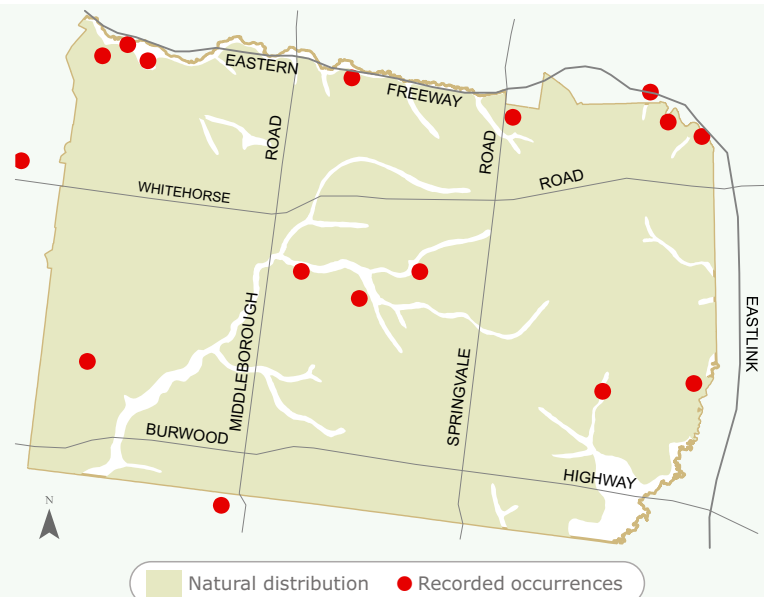
