



Dillwynia cinerascens

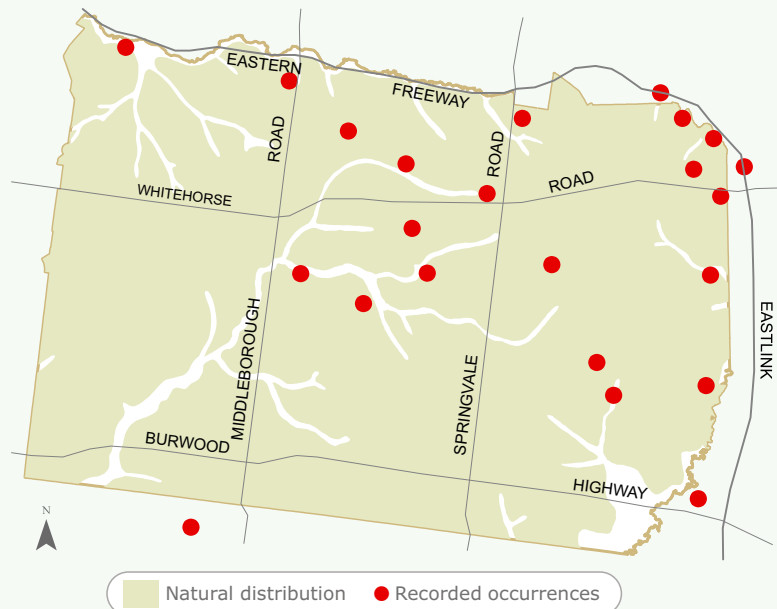
Grey Parrot Pea

Height:	0.6m - 1.5m
Width:	0.5m - 1.5m
Habit:	A small open, erect or spreading understorey shrub.
Foliage:	Thin greyish-green leaves to 2cm long.
Flowers:	Clusters of yellow and orange pea flowers at the end of branches. Flowers from July to November.
Requirements:	Adaptable, well drained soils. Partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Very showy in flower. Suited for planting under established trees or for lightly shaded areas. Drought and frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

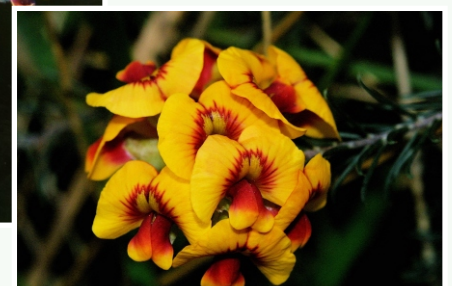
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
