



Einadia nutans

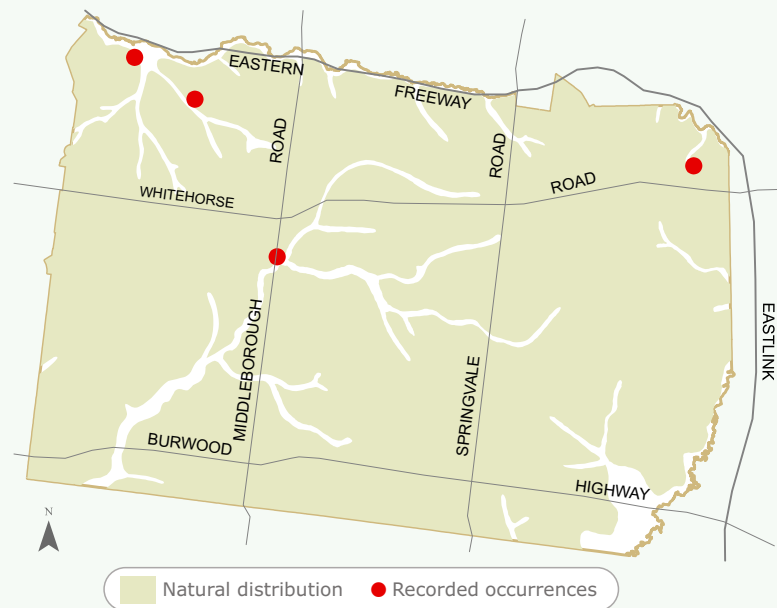
Nodding Saltbush, Climbing Saltbush

Height:	30cm
Width:	1.2m
Habit:	Sprawling or scrambling shrub, stems trailing from central rootstock.
Foliage:	Broad spearhead-like grey-green leaves to 3cm long.
Flowers:	Clusters of insignificant greenish flowers on the end of stems, followed by small succulent red berries from December to May.
Requirements:	Well drained drier soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Hardy vigorous shrub, useful as a groundcover for dry banks. May be established beneath existing trees. A good plant for rockeries. Drought resistant, sensitive to frost when young. Bird attracting.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
