



# *Eryngium vesiculosum*

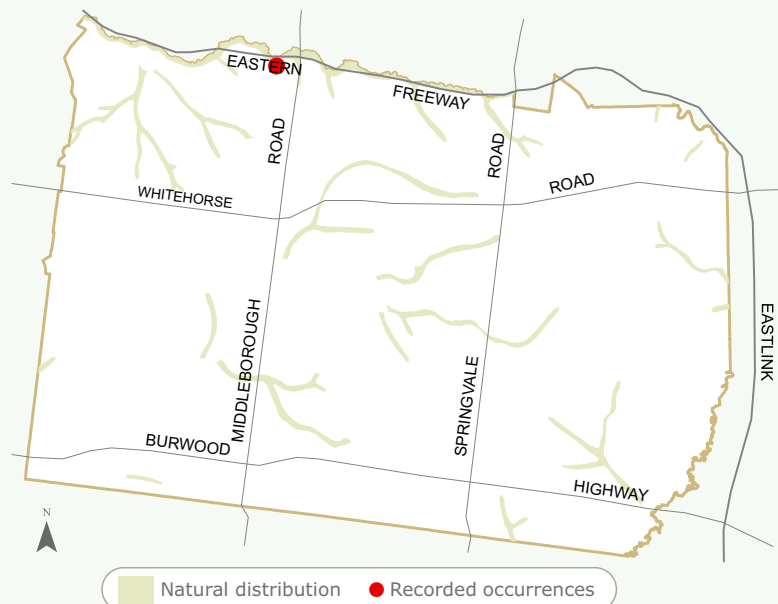
## Prickfoot

<b>Height:</b>	10cm - 20cm
<b>Width:</b>	30cm - 60cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Tufted perennial thistle-like herb.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Bright green lance-like leaves with sharp spiny toothed edges from 5-20cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Small round pale blue flowerheads surrounded by prickly spines. Flowers from October to February.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Moist soils, withstands wet conditions. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An interesting plant for bog gardens or for growing in a container. Ensure that the base of the plant remains moist.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
