



Eucalyptus globoidea

White Stringybark

Height:	10m - 30m
Width:	8m - 20m
Habit:	Upright medium tree with compact canopy and fibrous red-brown to grey stringy bark.
Foliage:	Juvenile leaves - round to egg-shaped with wavy edges and paler below to 6cm x 4cm. Adult leaves - glossy green lance-shaped to 6-10cm x 2.5cm.
Flowers:	Clusters of buds with pointed caps and white to cream flowers followed by hemispherical fruit. Flowers at any time of the year.
Requirements:	Adaptable to most soils, prefers moist situations. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Good shade tree for large gardens or parks. Tolerates light frost.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

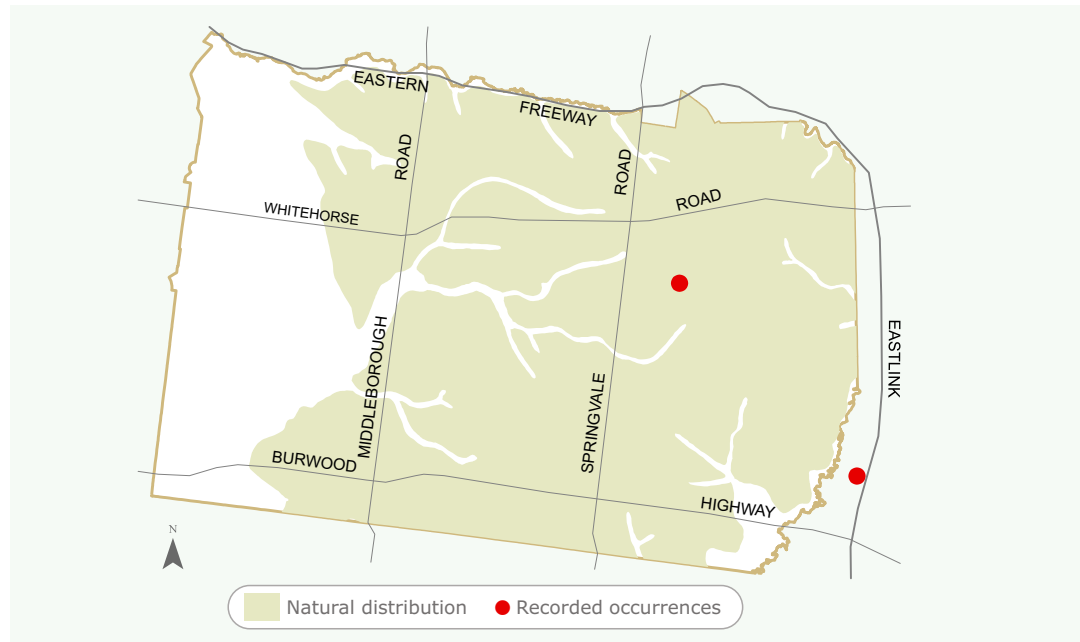
