



# *Eucalyptus macrorhyncha*

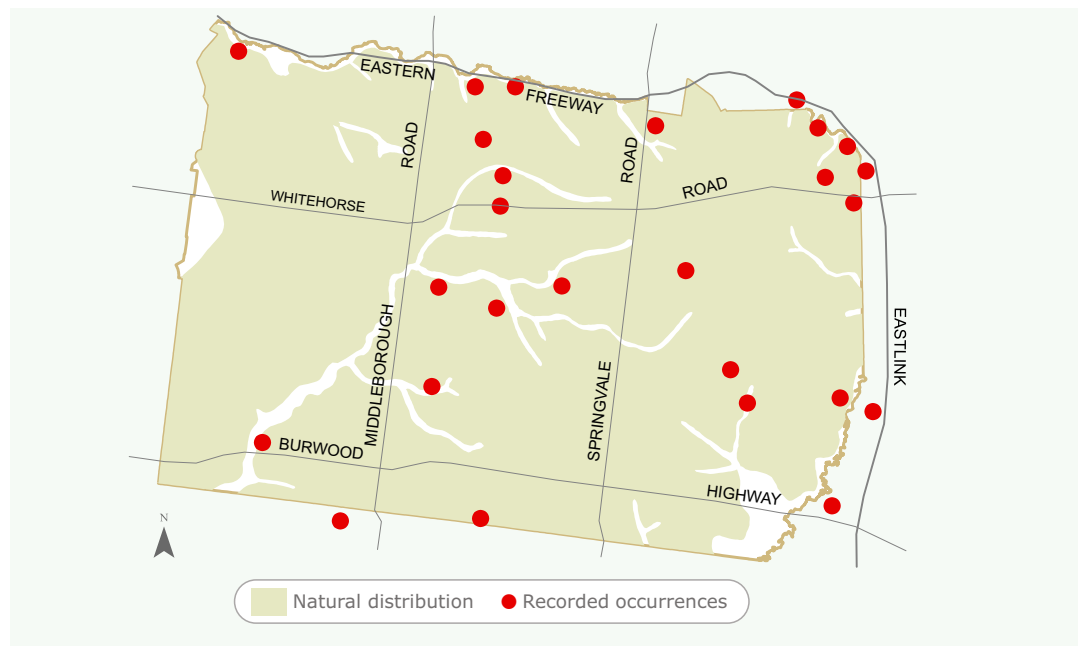
## Red Stringybark

<b>Height:</b>	10m - 35m
<b>Width:</b>	10m - 20m
<b>Habit:</b>	Medium to tall upright tree with red-brown to grey stringy deeply fissured bark and a rounded canopy.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Juvenile leaves - oblong with wavy margins to 3-5cm x 2-3cm. Adult leaves - glossy oblong lance-shaped to 6-15cm x 3-5cm.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Clusters of 7-11 diamond shaped buds with long caps, white to cream flowers with a sweet honey aroma. Flowers from January to April. Round-elliptical shaped fruit.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils, prefers clay loam. Does not tolerate wet soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	Attractive shade tree for large areas. Tree roots are sensitive to compaction of soil.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
