



Eucalyptus viminalis

Manna Gum, Ribbon Gum

Height:	10m - 50m
Width:	8m - 15m
Habit:	Fast-growing tall upright tree with open canopy. Rough bark persists at the base. Bark is shed in long ribbons during summer, leaving the upper trunk smooth and white.
Foliage:	Juvenile leaves - dark green lance to broad shaped to 3.5cm-6.5cm x 1-3cm. Adult - green and glossy, narrow, often sickle-shaped to 20cm long.
Flowers:	Clusters of 3 or 4 egg-shaped buds followed by white flowers from January to May. Rounded shaped fruit.
Requirements:	Adaptable, tolerating a range of conditions, though prefers moist, well drained soils. Full sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A good ornamental and shade tree with an attractive white trunk suited for large gardens or parklands. Food source for koalas.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

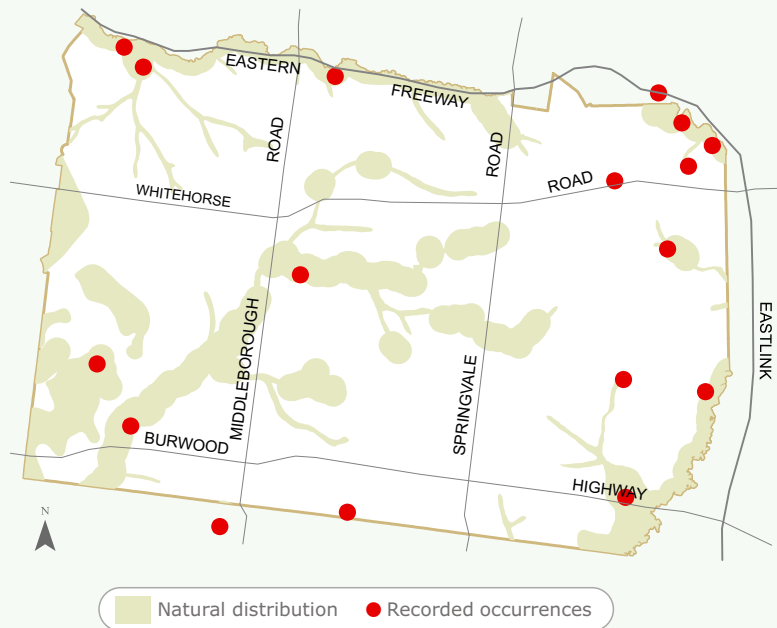
