



# *Glycine clandestina*

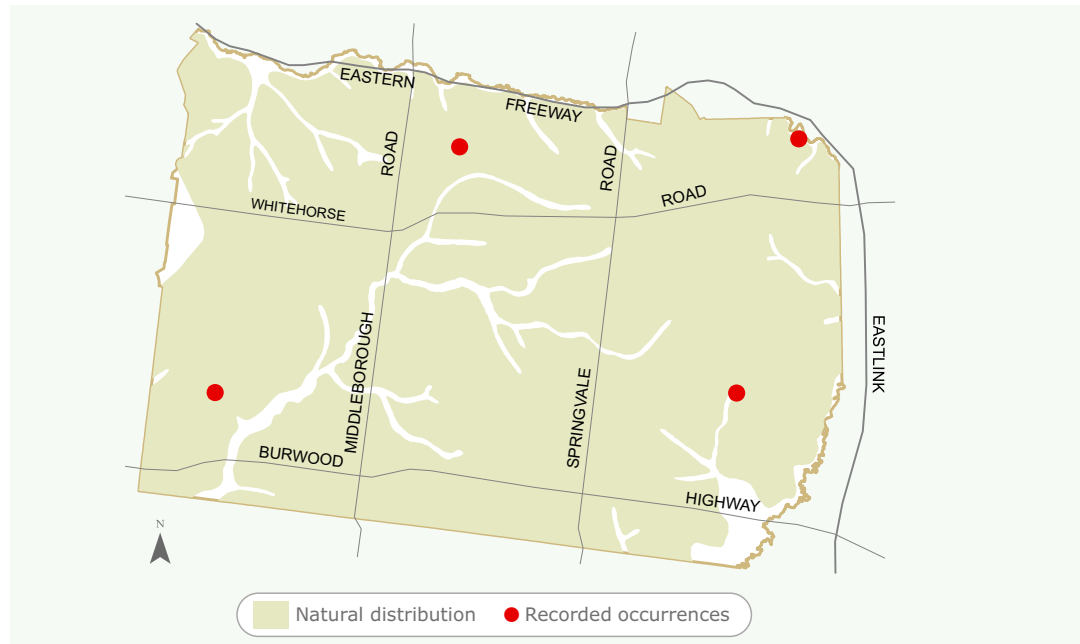
## Twining Glycine

<b>Height:</b>	Twining 0.3m - 2m tall
<b>Width:</b>	Climber
<b>Habit:</b>	Slender open twiner.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Scattered dark-green oblong leaves composed of 3 leaflets to 4cm long on hairy stems and branches.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Loose clusters of small blue-mauve pea flowers periodically throughout the year.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Moist, well drained soils, tolerating dry periods once established. Shade or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	A gentle twining plant for climbing through other plants with attractive sprays of flowers, useful for shaded areas.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
