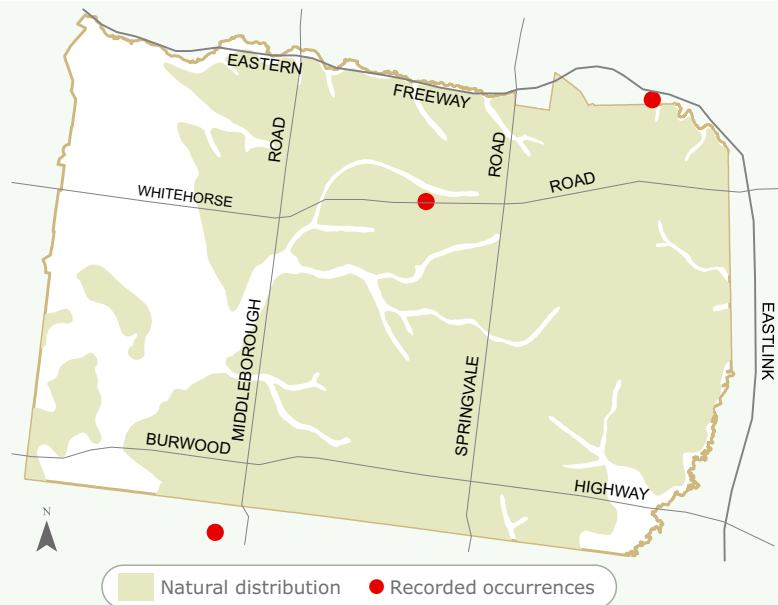
Silky Hakea, Bushy Needlewood

| Height: | 2m - 5m |
| Width: | 1m - 3m |
| Habit: | Fast-growing erect open to dense prickly shrub with stiff branches that are slightly pendulous. |
| Foliage: | Fine, stiff, prickly needle-like leaves to 6cm long. |
| Flowers: | Masses of fragrant white or occasionally pink flowers, from May to September. Rough fruit, 4cm long with a double-pointed beak. |
| Requirements: | Adaptable to most conditions. Full or partial sun. |
| Cultivation & uses: | A hardy shrub with prickly foliage providing a safe habitat for birds. Pruning is beneficial. Drought tolerant. |

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
