



# *Hardenbergia violacea* (local form)

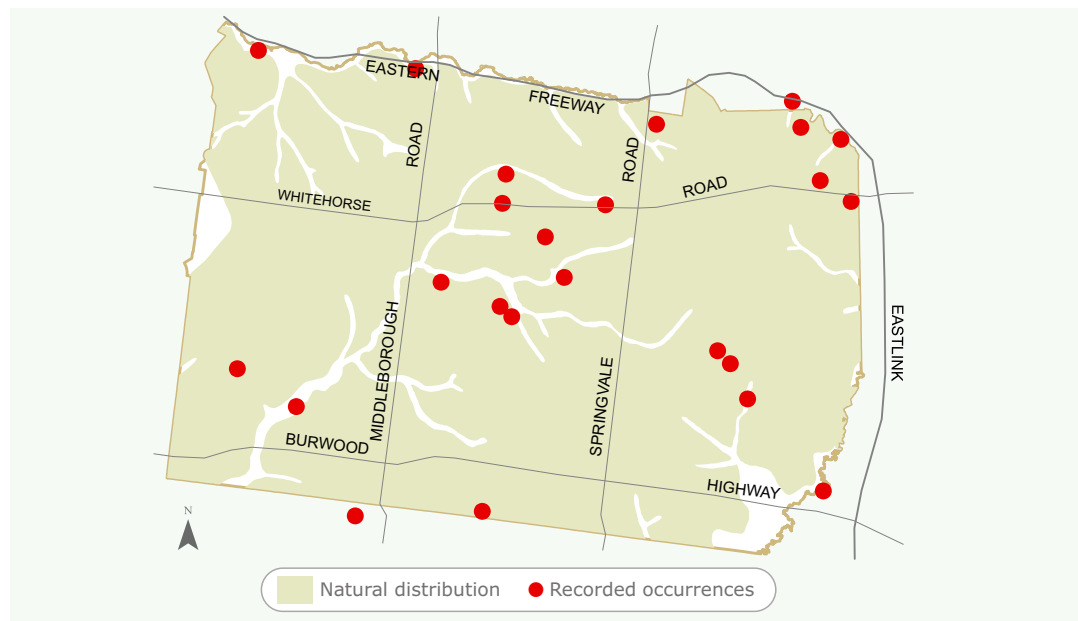
## Purple Coral Pea, False Sarsparilla

<b>Height:</b>	Trailer to 2m
<b>Width:</b>	Prostrate
<b>Habit:</b>	Fast-growing dense creeper or wiry scrambler.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Leathery dark green oval to lance-shaped leaves to 10cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Sprays of violet to purple pea flowers massed along branches. Flowers from July to November.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	A showy, vibrant scrambling climber with many forms and cultivars available. Different forms can climb, trail or have a more upright habit. Generally a hardy garden plant useful for covering embankments, lightly twining over shrubs or trained to climb up structures such as pergolas and fences.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
