



Indigofera australis

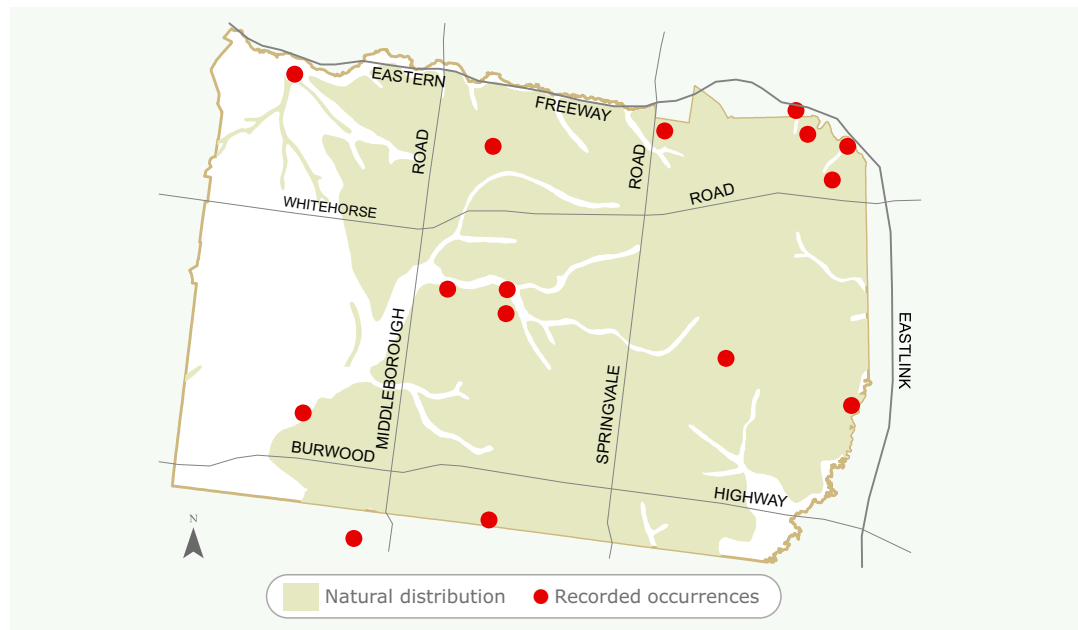
Austral Indigo

Height:	1m - 2m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	A slender open, erect to spreading shrub.
Foliage:	Blue-green oval-shaped leaves to 1-3cm long, almost fernlike in appearance.
Flowers:	Sprays of mauve pea flowers from September to December. Flowers are occasionally white or pink.
Requirements:	Adaptable, well drained soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A hardy, attractive plant providing a delicate accent in the garden. Ideal for planting beneath existing trees or shady sites. Tip prune regularly to promote bushy growth. Will tolerate extended periods of dryness once established.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

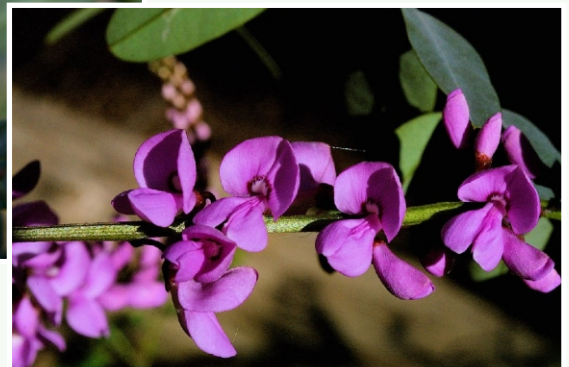
