



Juncus pallidus

Pale Rush

Height:	0.5m - 2.3m
Width:	0.3m - 1m
Habit:	A tall tufted perennial rush spreading from underground stems.
Foliage:	Pale green leafy stems with loose pale brown sheath-like leaves to 15cm long that are darker brown towards the base.
Flowers:	Erect, loose or dense branching clusters of pale yellow flowers borne at the tip of stems from December to March.
Requirements:	Adaptable to most conditions, preferring moist or seasonally wet poorly drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Vigorous grower for near water or seasonally inundated areas. Useful as a border or screening plant or as an accent plant in the garden. Requires periodic inundation for optimum growth.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

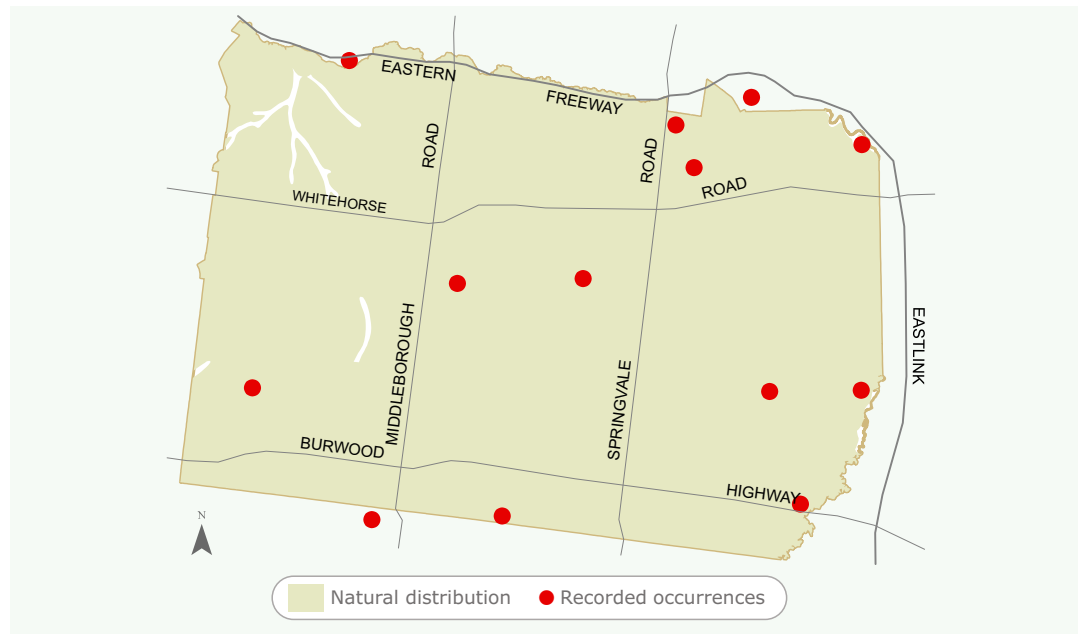
