

Lepidosperma laterale

Variable Sword-Sedge

Height:

0.4m - 1m

Width:

0.8m - 1m

Habit:

Tufting perennial sedge spreading from short underground stems.

Foliage:

Narrow, stiff dark green strap-like leaves and stems. Leaves have sharp edges with shiny reddish or dark greyish brown sheaths at base.

Flowers:

Loose clusters of red-brown flowers in a narrow, erect spray at the end of stems. Flowers from September to March.

Requirements:

Adaptable. Partial sun.

Cultivation & uses:


A variable, hardy feature plant for gardens useful for rockeries and mass plantings. Care must be taken where planted due to its sharp edges. Butterfly and bird attractor.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
