



Leptospermum continentale

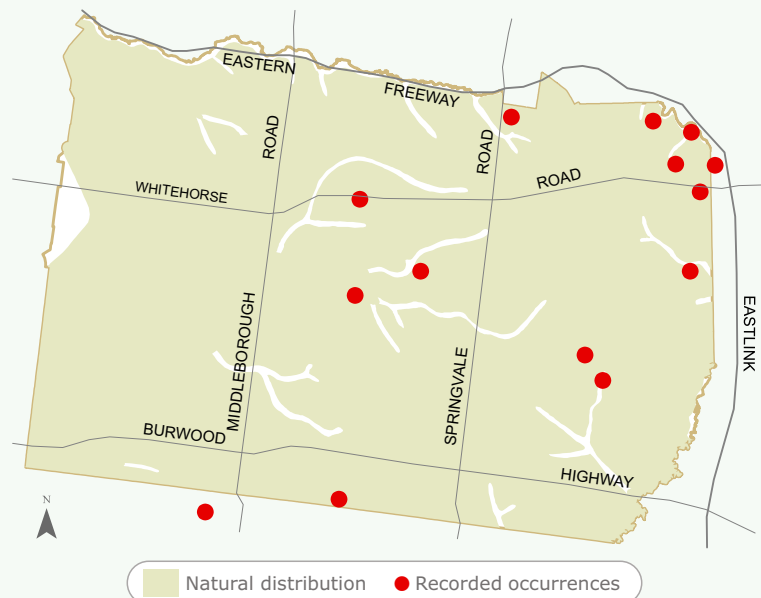
Prickly Tea-tree

Height:	1m - 4m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	A rigid and upright, dense or straggling prickly shrub.
Foliage:	Stiff, narrow prickly leaves to 12mm long x 3mm wide with a sharp pointed tip.
Flowers:	Masses of white petalled flowers to 1cm wide along stems from October to March.
Requirements:	Adaptable, tolerating most soils and aspects. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive and hardy plant suitable for poorly drained sites. Useful as a screen and benefits from pruning. Good habitat plant. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
