



# *Lomandra filiformis*

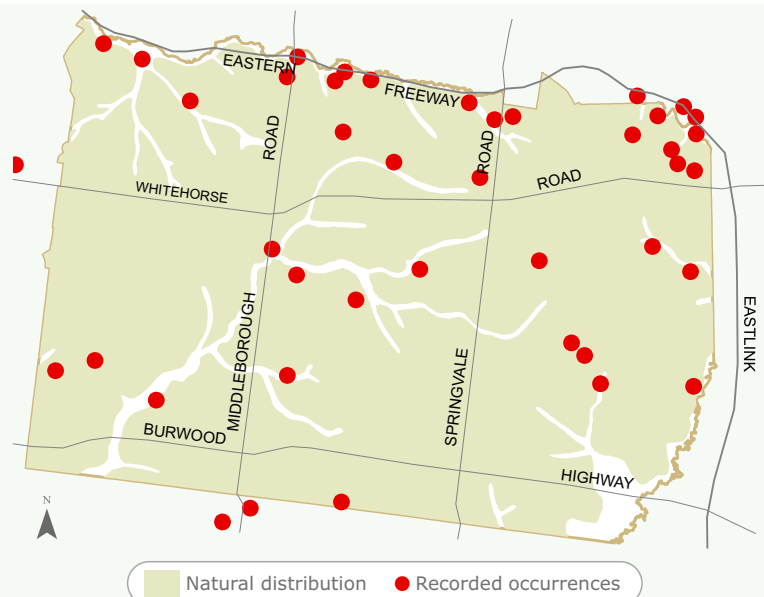
## Wattle Mat-rush

<b>Height:</b>	15cm - 50cm
<b>Width:</b>	15cm - 20cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Lightly tufted grass-like perennial herb with a semi-arching habit, spreading by underground stems.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Narrow pointed stiff blue-green to green leaves to 5mm wide.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Yellow flowerheads to 30cm long on fine short branches. The flowers are reminiscent of small wattle buds. Male flowers are ball-shaped, while female flowers are more tubular. Flowers from September to December.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils, preferring moist sites. Tolerating dryness once established. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An attractive hardy plant useful for rockeries, mass plantings and borders. Suitable for containers. Drought and frost tolerant.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
