



Lomandra longifolia

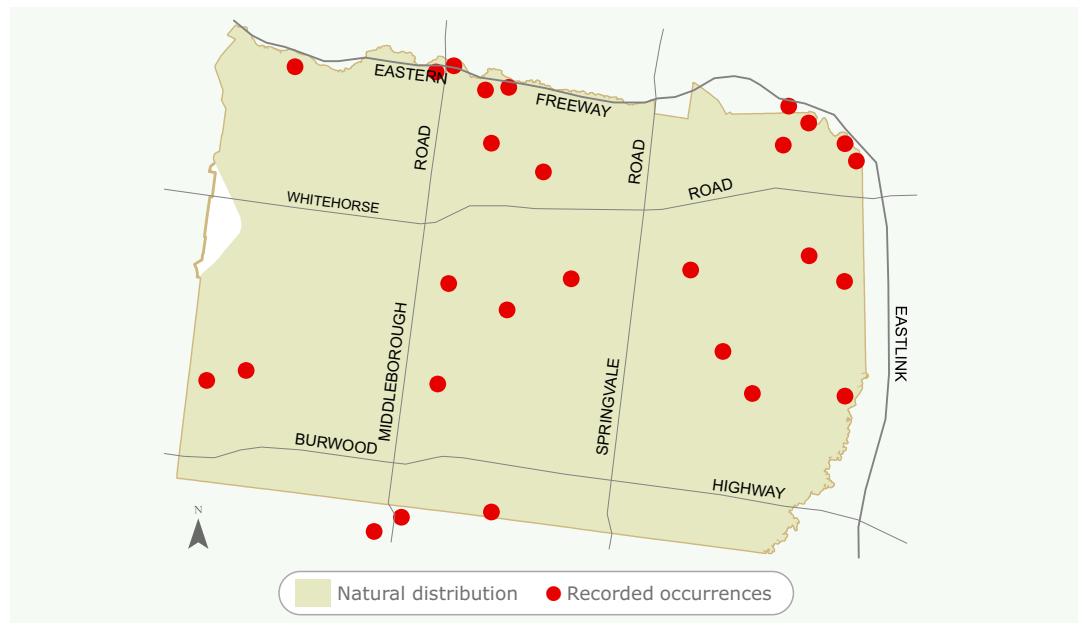
Spiny-headed Mat-rush

Height:	0.5m - 1m
Width:	0.5m - 1.2m
Habit:	Large dense tussock plant.
Foliage:	Bright green, firm and smooth strap-like leaves up to 1m long x 12mm wide.
Flowers:	Yellowish scented flowers in clusters on branches along a flattened stem, with spiky bracts 3cm long at the base of each flower cluster. Green shiny brown-orange capsules remain for most of the year. Flowers from September to December.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Adaptable, tolerating a range of sites. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A versatile and hardy landscaping plant, ideal for planting in clusters or in large drifts. Good for stabilising river and creek banks. Grows well beneath established trees. Highly drought and frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
