



Mazus pumilio

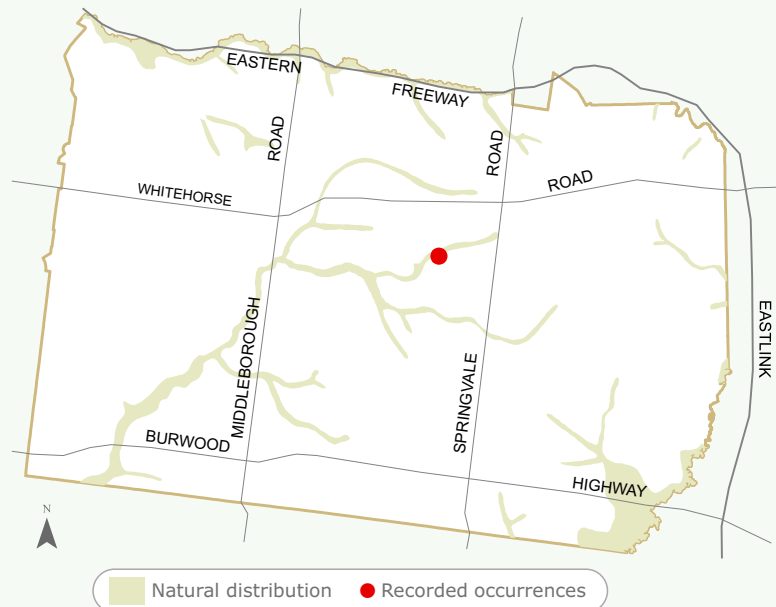
Swamp Mazus

Height:	3cm
Width:	0.5m - 1m
Habit:	Low perennial herb suckering to form a dense mat.
Foliage:	Glossy spoon-shaped leaves 8-65mm long with toothed, wavy edges.
Flowers:	White or mauve flowers on erect stems to 25mm long. The flowers are unusually asymmetrical having very large lower petals and a small upper petal. Flowers from October to March.
Requirements:	Moist to wet soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive groundcover for boggy areas or around edges of water.

Local Distribution:

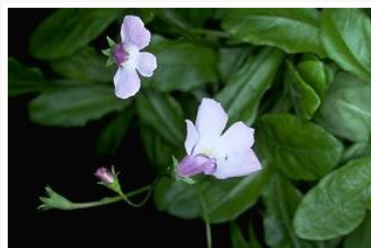
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
