



Melicytus dentatus

Tree Violet

Height:	2m - 4m
Width:	1m - 2.5m
Habit:	A medium to tall rigid, often spiny, spreading shrub.
Foliage:	Dark green oblong toothed leaves to 5cm long.
Flowers:	Masses of fragrant tiny cream bell flowers, hanging along branches from September to November, followed by pale green to purple berries.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, preferring moist sites. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A hardy variable shrub useful for lightly shaded sites and moist areas.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

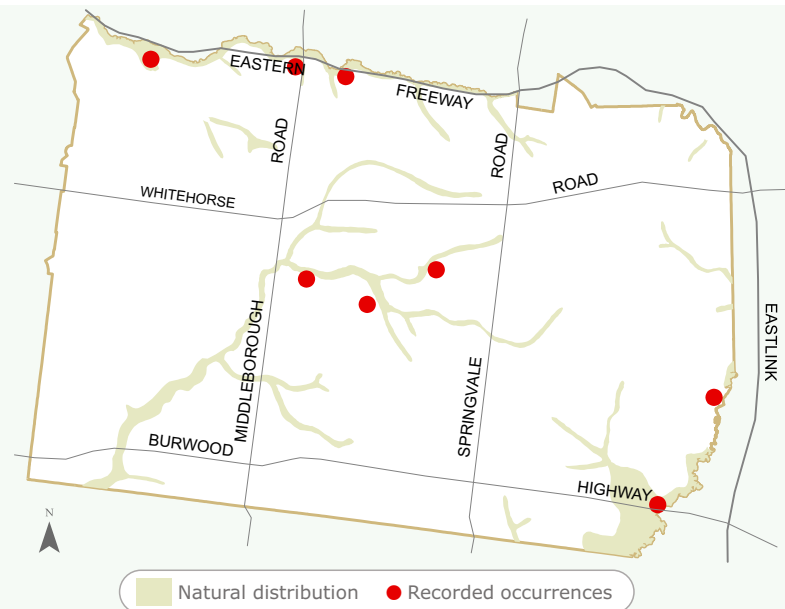
