



Mentha australis

River Mint

Height:	20cm - 80cm
Width:	0.3m - 1m
Habit:	A soft sprawling, sometimes erect, perennial herb.
Foliage:	Light-green, soft, lance-shaped leaves with toothed margins to 5cm long. Leaves have a minty aroma.
Flowers:	Small white to pale mauve tubular flowers in clusters towards the end of upright stems. Flowers from September to March.
Requirements:	Moist soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful for containers, rockeries and for moist and shady areas. May become invasive in ideal conditions, which can be controlled by regular clippings.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

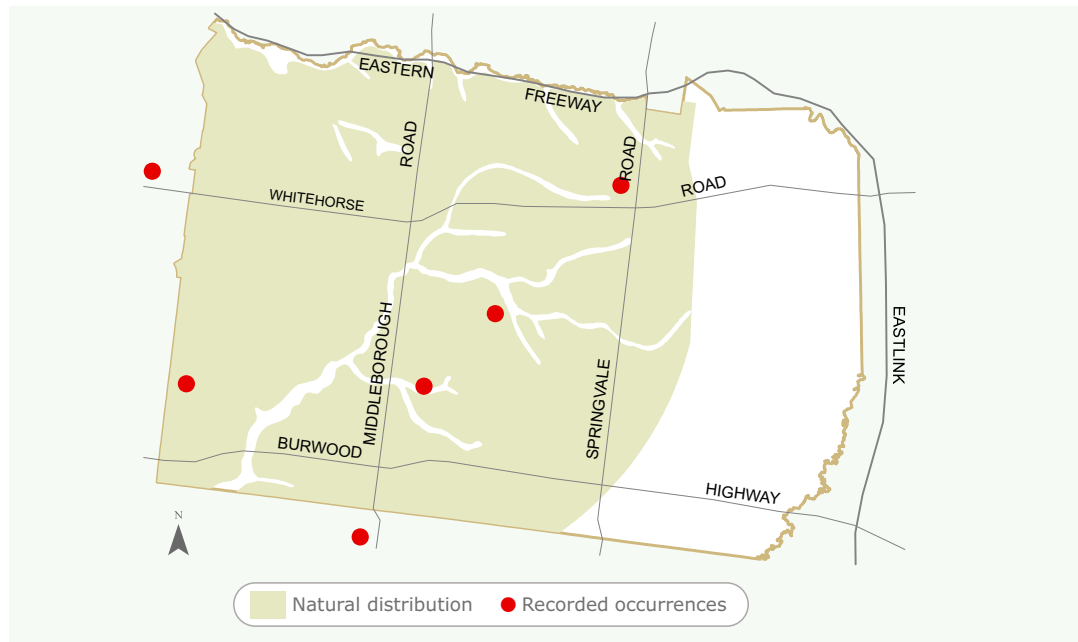
