



Microlaena stipoides

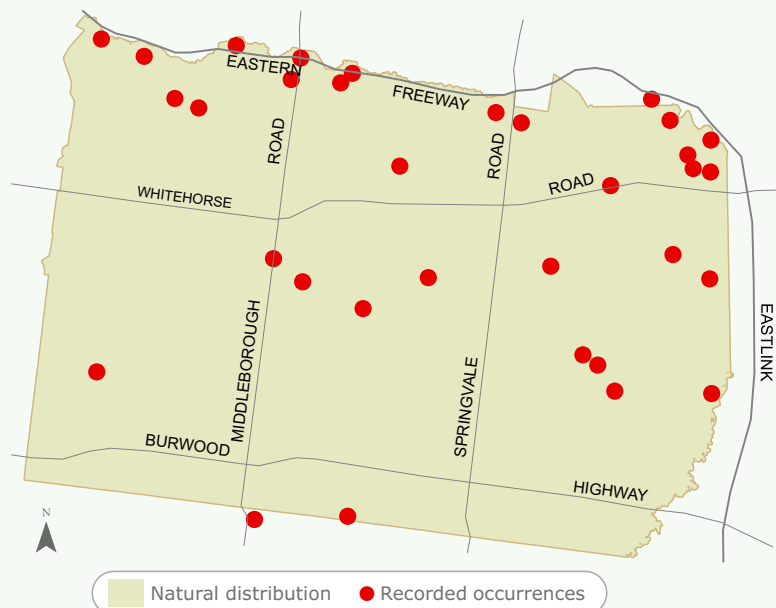
Weeping Grass

Height:	To 30cm, stems to 1m
Width:	To 60cm
Habit:	A small, slender, tufted perennial grass with arching or erect stems, spreading from underground stems.
Foliage:	Soft, flat grass-like dark-green leaves to 8cm long.
Flowers:	Green to purple tinged narrow flowerheads to 20cm long at the end of slender stems. Flowers from September to November, though may flower at other times in ideal conditions.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, tolerating a range of conditions, preferring moist and shadier sites. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Weeping Grass is a cool season grass that produces year-long green growth, and is an ideal grass for shady areas. It may be used as a native lawn grass that will tolerate mowing or as ornamental plantings in rockeries and beneath existing trees. The seeds may catch on clothing.

Local Distribution:

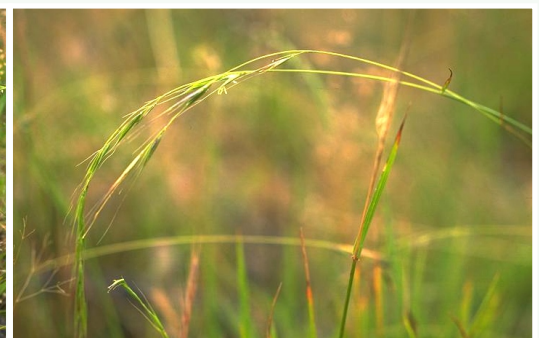
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
