



Pelargonium australe

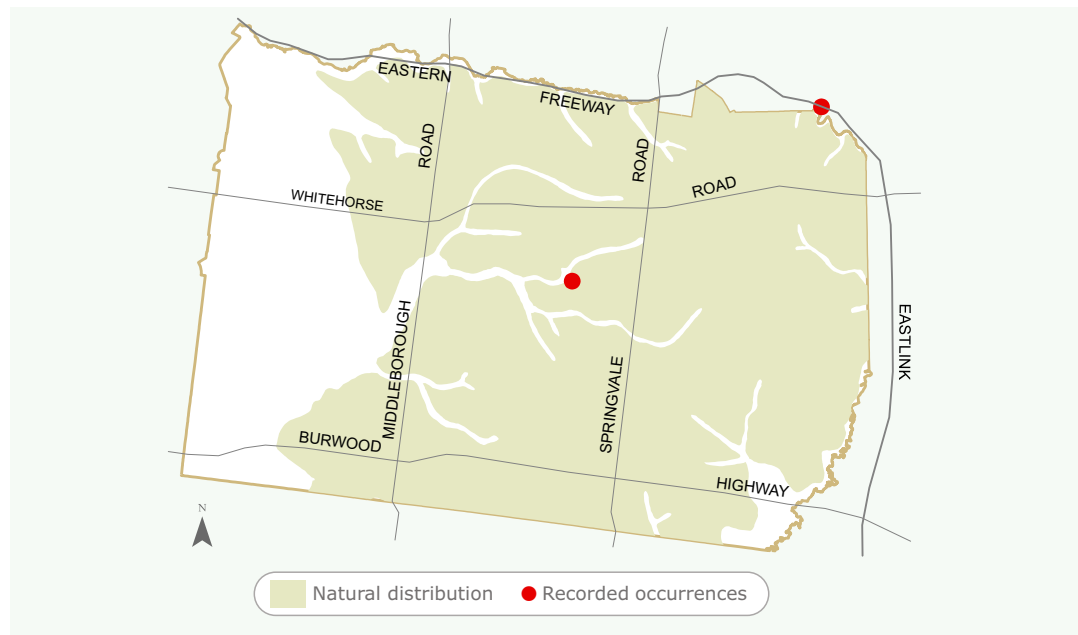
Austral Stork's Bill

Height:	30cm - 60cm
Width:	0.3m - 1m
Habit:	A small, soft and hairy perennial herb forming a clump.
Foliage:	Soft velvety round-shaped hairy leaves to 2-9cm long. Scented foliage.
Flowers:	Clusters of pink or white flowers with crimson to purple streaks, on long stalks. Flowers from October to February.
Requirements:	Adaptable, well drained soils, tolerating dryness once established. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive rockery or container plant. Useful as a soil binder. May die back to rootstock during hot periods.

Local Distribution:

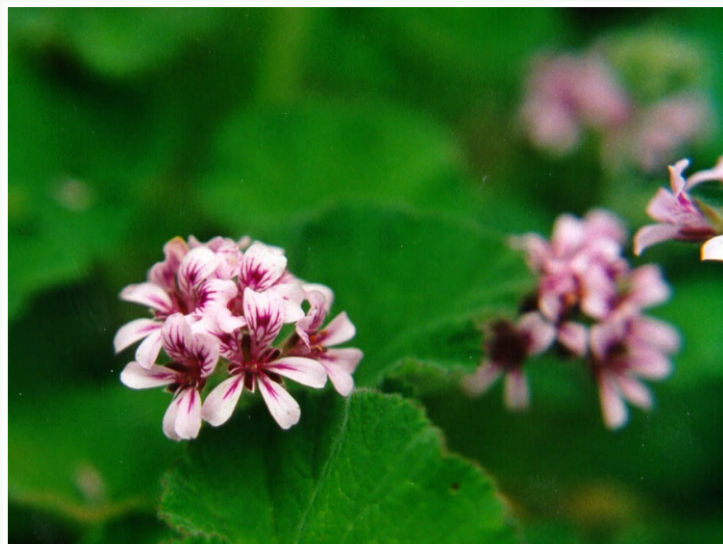
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
