



Poa labillardierei

Common Tussock Grass

Height:	30cm - 80cm, stems to 1.2m high
Width:	60cm - 80cm
Habit:	Large, coarse densely tufted tussock with radiating roots.
Foliage:	Green, greyish-green or blue-green slender, rough leaves to 80cm x 1-3.5mm.
Flowers:	Green, purple to straw-coloured open flowerheads to 25cm held on erect stems. Flowers from October to February.
Requirements:	Adaptable, preferring moist to slightly dry soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A vigorous and hardy grass with many forms, commonly used in landscaping. Useful for erosion control, mass planting in drifts or to add vertical interest to a garden. Colour may change with season or age. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

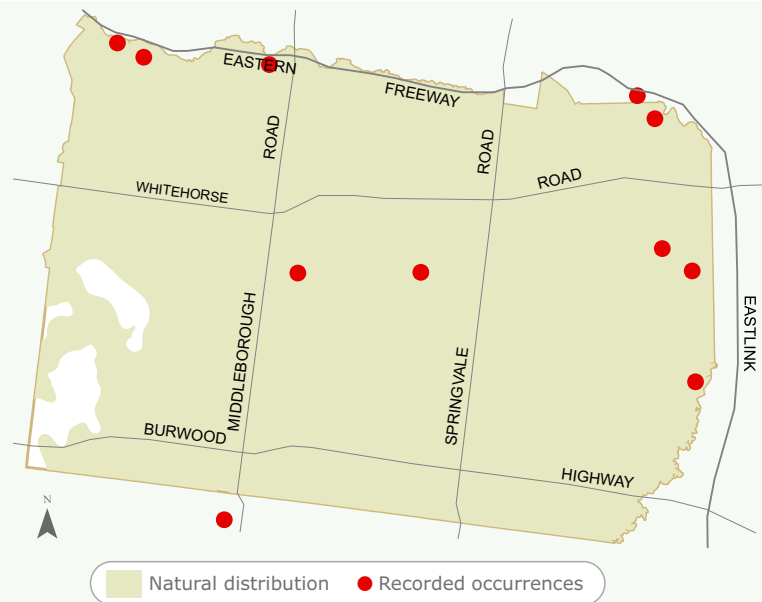
