



Poa sieberiana

Grey Tussock Grass

Height:	15cm - 30cm, stems to 90cm high
Width:	40cm
Habit:	A rounded small dense perennial tussock grass with slender leaves.
Foliage:	Fine grass-like greyish-green leaves.
Flowers:	Long green, purple to straw-coloured flowerheads to 25cm long on erect stems. Flowers from October to March.
Requirements:	Adaptable, well drained soils. Tolerates dryness. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A small attractive feature plant useful for rockeries, borders or mass planting in drifts. May be grown beneath existing trees.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

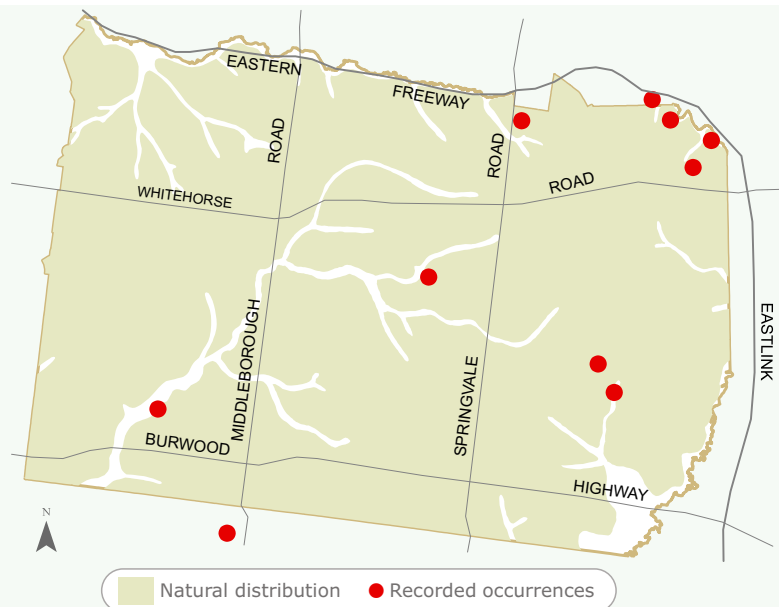
