



# *Ranunculus inundatus*

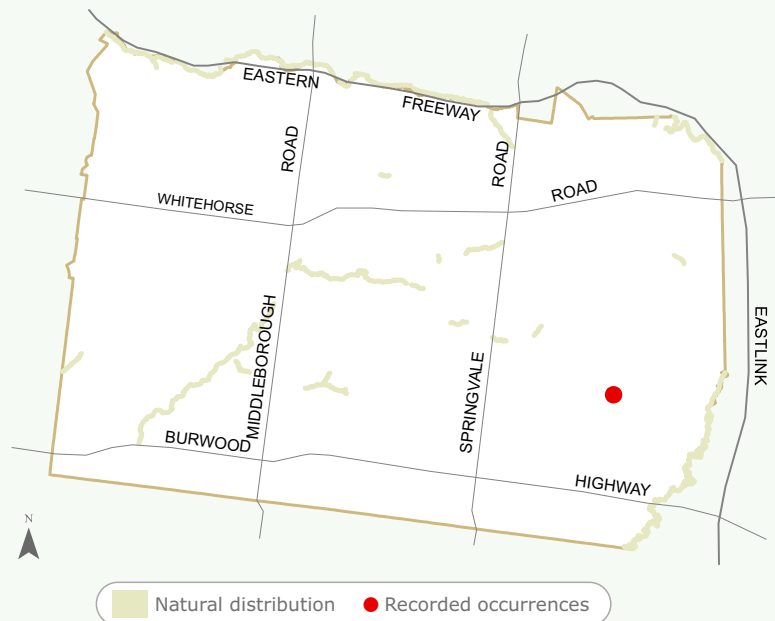
## River Buttercup

<b>Height:</b>	5cm - 30cm
<b>Width:</b>	Spreading
<b>Habit:</b>	An aquatic or semi-aquatic perennial herb often forming large mats.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Leaves to 2cm long, divided into very narrow segments.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Yellow star flowers with 5 to 7 petals to 15mm wide on long erect stems. Flowers from September to January.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Moist to wet soils. Shade or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	The River Buttercup grows mostly in permanently wet sites. A very attractive groundcover, useful for around wet areas or in shallow water, such as ponds and wetlands.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
