



# *Themeda triandra*

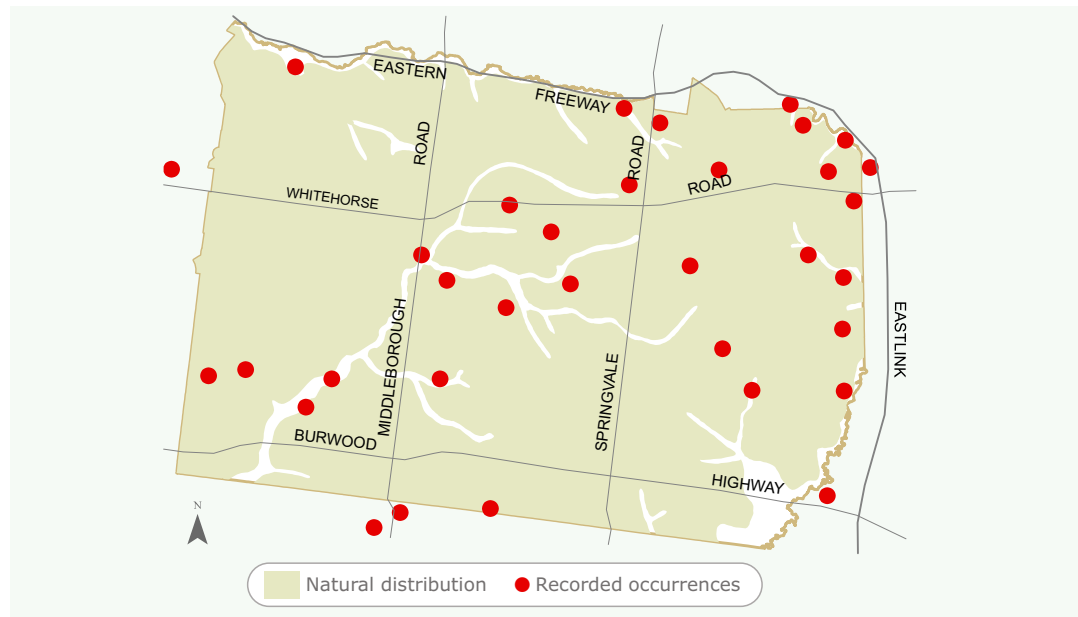
## Kangaroo Grass

<b>Height:</b>	40cm - 75cm, stems to 90cm
<b>Width:</b>	50cm - 70cm
<b>Habit:</b>	Soft, erect or spreading perennial tussock.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Narrow-linear green to greyish leaves that often develop some purple and red tones on the edges. Leaves to 30cm long x 3-4mm wide and dry to an orange-brown in summer.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Large green and red-brown flowerheads on slightly arching stems from September to February.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable to most soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	One of Australia's most widespread grasses. An attractive grass, providing an ornamental addition to a garden for its interesting colour and texture. Requires little water once established. May be pruned back.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.

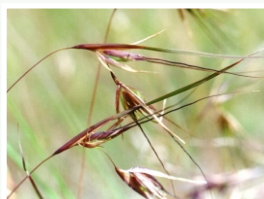
