



# *Viminaria juncea*

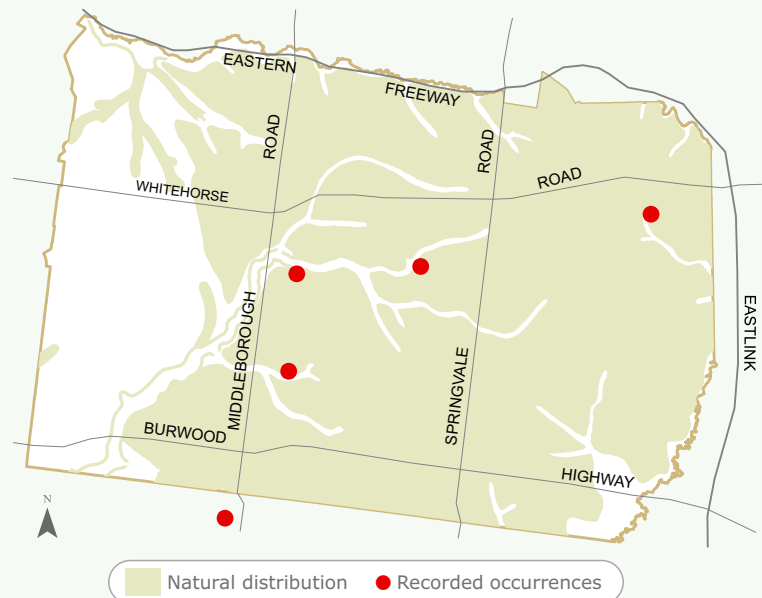
## Native Broom, Golden Spray

<b>Height:</b>	2.5m - 5m
<b>Width:</b>	2m
<b>Habit:</b>	A fast-growing slender erect shrub with pendulous branches.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Long flexible needle-like branchlets to 30cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Long drooping sprays of yellow-orange pea flowers from October to February.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable to a range of situations, including poorly drained soils, salt and lime. Prefers slightly moister soils. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	A hardy shrub which is most attractive when in flower which draws attention to its graceful weeping habit. Can be short lived.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
