



Wahlenbergia gracilis

Australian Bluebell, Sprawling Bluebell

Height:	10cm - 50cm
Width:	15cm - 30cm
Habit:	Tufted sprawling perennial herb with sparsely branched erect flowering stems and a vigorous root system.
Foliage:	Oblong leaves to 3cm long.
Flowers:	Tiny soft blue flowers in the form of open bells to 6mm wide at the end of stems, flowering from September to November.
Requirements:	Moist, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Generally short lived, but may seed freely in ideal conditions. Plants may die back to the roots during long periods of dryness.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

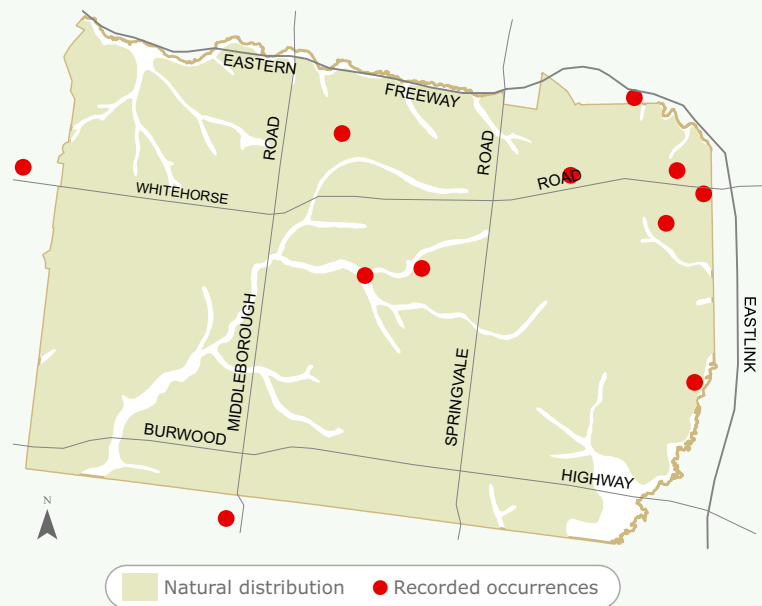
