



# *Xanthorrhoea minor*

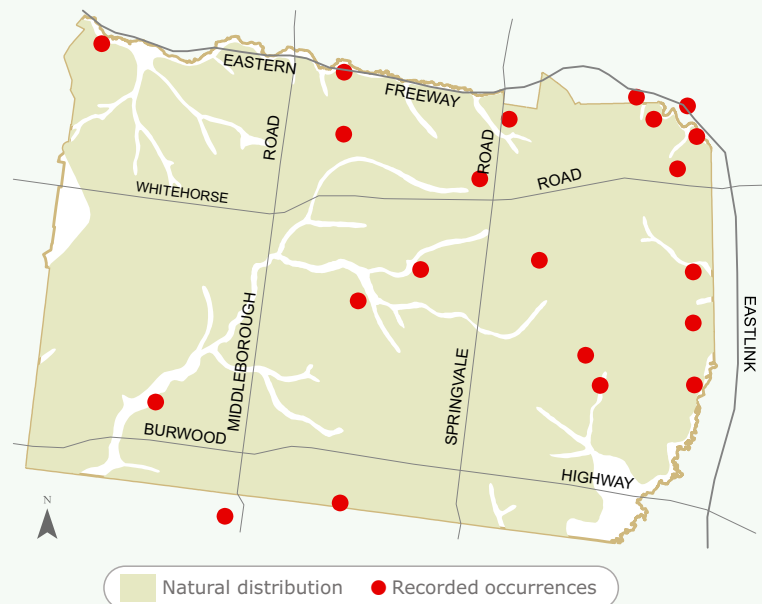
## Small Grass Tree

<b>Height:</b>	0.6m - 1m
<b>Width:</b>	0.2m - 1m
<b>Habit:</b>	Very slow growing perennial stout plant with its trunk branched beneath the ground.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Green to blue-green loosely arching grass-like leaves to 1m long x 2-4mm wide growing from the base of the plant at ground level.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Dense clusters of yellowish, strongly scented flowers arranged in a spike 5-20cm long held on a slender stem. Plants may bear several spikes, flowering from November to February.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils is essential. Tolerates dryness once established. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An attractive plant and impressive when the plant displays several flowering stems. A good ornamental plant for containers and useful for rockeries or growing beneath trees. Bird attracting.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
